


Marblehead's Little Harbor is where Marblehead's early settlement began c. 1629




Discover unfamiliar stories about these exquisite coastal zones \mathcal{E} learn about preservation of these priceless open spaces















Little Harbor's two off - shore islands are preserved as natural open spaces in perpetuity due to their donations in 2018 & 1955 to the Trustees of Reservations, which manages nearly 120 miles of coastline in MA and nearly the same number of total properties in the state.







Crowninshield Island (formerly Brown's) was given by Louise DuPont Crowninshield in 1955. Gerry's Island was donated by Ted & Julie Moore in 2018. An endowment for ongoing preservation of both islands was raised by contributions to the Trustees from many people.
